



Fretboard Chart 5 String Bass

The chart doesn't or end at any precise frets on a real fretboard.

You decide what chord you want to look for and then start by finding its Root, ®.

For example, to find an **Am7b5 chord**, First find the Root 'A' on the 6th, 5th or 4th string, then look for *b3*, *b5* and *b7* on the higher strings. Try looking for other combinations (and inversions) until you find the voicing that works best in your particular arrangement.

To avoid cluttering the chart, I have not included 9th's, 11th's or 13th's. Just remember that....

- A 9th is an octave above a 2nd
- An 11th is an octave above a 4th
- A 13th is an octave above a 6th
